#### Interleaving continued

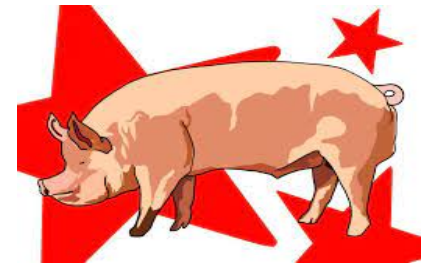
- Producing integrated comparisons of anthology & unseen poems.

- Embedding critical theory to explore alternative interpretations.



### Autumn Term

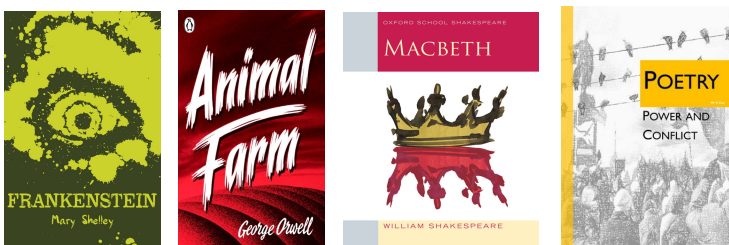
#### Interleaving
